

(賛成の解答例)

I agree that summertime shifts are a good idea for three reasons. First, they would reduce traffic jams. If many workers started work earlier, the traffic would be spread over a longer period of time. Workers wouldn't be caught in traffic jams, and everyone could get to work quicker. The same thing would happen at night because everyone would go home at different times. Everyone could save a lot of travel time. Next, they would be good for families. Parents would get home from work earlier, and the whole family could have dinner together. Finally, people would have more time to relax in the evening. It stays light outside later in the summer. People can go outside and enjoy the summer weather after dinner. They can exercise and take part in summer events. In conclusion, because they would reduce traffic jams, increase family time, and give workers more time to enjoy summer activities, I think summertime shifts are a good idea. (161 words)

(反対の解答例)

I don't agree with "earlier summertime shifts" for three reasons. First, they would be bad for business. If everyone has different schedules, people won't be able to communicate with people in other companies or offices. If workers aren't there when you need to talk to them, it is a problem for everyone. Second, it would be hard for some workers to adjust to a new schedule. If they have to get up two hours earlier every day, they might be tired all the time and unable to do their jobs properly. Finally, people will probably have to work longer. Many people work overtime now. If they are afraid to leave early because people might think they are not a good worker, they will not get home any earlier. They will work more and be more tired. Therefore, because it will not be convenient for business, will be hard to adjust to a new schedule, and people will work more and be tired all the time, summertime shifts are a bad idea. (168 words)
